

MIL Competencies & Student Research Journals: A Proposed Study

Subjects: Undergraduate students who have participated in student research journals hosted in institutional repositories

Purpose: To measure attainment of MIL competencies 2 & 3 (Evaluation and Use of information)

Outcomes: Refine rubrics for improved assessment; design course modules & curricula

Future Possibilities

To foster intercultural dialogue through global participation in undergraduate student research journals

Challenges for global expansion and sharing


